ADMISSION POLICIES

Maximum community college credit hours applicable to Lincoln University: 64

Junior standing: 60 to 89 credit hours

Minimum GPA for admission: 2.0 cumulative GPA

NOTE: Transfer students whose cumulative GPA is less than 2.0 may be admitted to Lincoln University on a probational basis at the University's discretion.

St. Louis Community College courses numbered 100 level or above may be accepted for transfer credit provided a grade of "C" or better was earned.

Admission to the Teacher Education Program requires a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher. See school catalog for additional requirements for admission to the Teacher Education programs.

Calculation of GPA for admission: cumulative GPA as calculated by STLCC on all college level courses (100 level or above course work).

Repeated courses: only the highest grade is accepted.

TV courses: will be accepted in transfer.

Departmental credit-by-examination, College Level Examination (CLEP)* and Pass-Fail credit will be accepted in transfer.

Calculation of GPA for Bachelor's degree: includes only grades from courses taken at Lincoln University.

* CLEP score must be equal to or greater than the Lincoln University cut-off score for the particular CLEP exam.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

Foreign Language Requirement – In addition to specified general education requirements, twelve (12) hours in one language are required for the BA degree programs. See school catalog for specific language.

University Seminar Requirement – GE 101 University Seminar (1 credit hour), is required for full-time freshmen. This requirement will be waived for students transferring 30 or more semester hours at STLCC.

Computer Skills Requirement – Computer literacy is required for all BA and BS programs. See school catalog for appropriate major requirements and / or course work.

TRANSFER WITH ASSOCIATE IN ARTS DEGREE

Students transferring to Lincoln University with an Associate in Arts degree will be admitted as juniors. The Associate in Arts degree will satisfy general education requirements at Lincoln. However, transfer students with the AA are not exempt from meeting any specialized lower division requirements of the major to which they transfer.

TRANSFER WITHOUT AN ASSOCIATE IN ARTS DEGREE

Students transferring without an Associate in Arts degree will have their transcripts evaluated on a course-by-course basis. All college level courses are considered. Courses which are developmental are not accepted in transfer.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

Any student applying for admission to Lincoln University must submit the following:

- Application for Admission and a \$17 non-refundable application fee.
- Official transcripts from all previous colleges or universities attended.
- A Lincoln University "Student Transfer Application" from the last college attended.
- ACT test scores and high school transcripts if transferring less than 30 semester hours.
